The Cosmetology Technician certificate provides the student with the knowledge and skills required to perform the functions of a cosmetologist in the field of beauty, design and salon management: hair and skin care, manicure, pedicure, cutting, rollers, waves, hairstyles, chemistry, electricity, hair drying and color techniques. The knowledge the student acquires will help them to perform in a job where they can perform work in beauty salons, beauty salon management, and homework. The certificate was designed with the objective of training students in the field of beauty in an adequate way and in accordance with the parameters of the Examining Board of Examining Board of Beauty Specialists of Puerto Rico. The student who participates in this certificate prepares to work and manage beauty salons.

Requirements:

- 1. Bundle materials to carry out the internship in the salon. The student may choose to purchase the materials or accept the charge of the lump in the tuition.
- 2. Uniform in the classroom.

Supervised Practice:

- 1. You will not be able to start the internship if you have not passed the following courses: CBEU 0130, CBEU 0140, CCOS 0210 and CCOS 0240.
- 2. Supervised practice that requires you to perform in a real-world work setting as part of the degree requirements. Complete 210 hours at the practice center.
- 3. These outside facilities can be state and federal agencies, hospitals, and nongovernmental organizations, among others. In some cases, the governing board or agency of the profession requires the student to meet certain requirements to participate in such a practice.
- 4. It is the student's responsibility to stay informed of these requirements and to ensure that he/she can meet them to complete the supervised internship requirement.
- 5. It will be the student's responsibility to comply with the requirements of the external center to carry out their internship.
- 6. Such requirements may be, depending on the practice center, health certificate, negative criminal record certificate or any other that the institution or practice center requires.
- 7. If the student refuses or is unable to comply with any of them, he/she may be unable to carry out his/her internship and, consequently, he/she may not pass the internship course or meet the graduation requirements of his/her academic program.

Note: All students must comply with all of the requirements in the Technical Certificate Program Catalog available on the <u>aguadilla.inter.edu</u> website. The student's official evaluation is conducted by the Registrar's Office and the graduation fee is charged at tuition in the second semester.

Concentration courses must be passed with a minimum grade of C, and in practice a minimum grade of B is required.
